The Longitudinal Aging Study Amsterdam and the challenge of informing policy and practice

Martijn Huisman studied Clinical and Health Psychology at Leiden University and Epidemiology at the Erasmus University Medical Center in Rotterdam, The Netherlands. Martijn is the current scientific director of the Longitudinal Aging Study Amsterdam (LASA), a study among several thousand older Dutch adults, which is the main source of information about the functioning of older people for the Dutch government and acts as the barometer of human ageing in the country. A complex infrastructure consisting of biomedical, psychological and social data, LASA has been ongoing since 1992. Martijn has a specific interest in the socioeconomic conditions that shape people's chances of having a good old age and people's ability to maintain good levels of functioning despite hardship.
