CLSA Data Access Application Deadlines

Please note the following upcoming [data access application](#) deadlines:

- October 16, 2017
- January 29, 2018
- June 11, 2018
- September 24, 2018

When planning your submission, please include in your timeframe at least six months from the application submission deadline to the time you hope to receive your dataset. Approved applicants are required to sign a CLSA Access Agreement that outlines the specific uses of data and the CLSA's expectations with respect to privacy and confidentiality. Ethics approval from the applicant's institution is also required prior to data release. These two components may take more time than anticipated.
